# Lethbridge Pregnancy Care Center Annual Report 2018





Diana\* first came to the Lethbridge Pregnancy Care Centre in December 2017 when a positive pregnancy test changed her world forever. She had been living with addictions and was just starting to get her feet under her after a really hard year. She was still struggling. Once she found out she was expecting she knew she had to change her life. She wanted better for her baby.

She worked very hard to stay clean during her pregnancy and to make healthy changes. She continued to come to the Centre to talk with her client advocate, share her struggles, and receive maternity clothes. During the chaos of those nine months the Centre became a stable source of support for Diana. In the spring of 2018, she gave birth to a healthy baby and became a mom.

Diana took on this new role as mom and learned as much as she could. She attended our Baby's First Year classes with enthusiasm. She was often the one encouraging the other moms in the class as they shared the joys and challenges of new motherhood.

Even though parenting at times was hard and addictions tried to come back into her life she never gave up. Whenever she came into the Centre, she was honest and shared her struggles openly with her client advocate. Amidst those struggles she never stopped fighting. She knew she was capable of providing the life her baby deserved.

Diana has been through a lot. She knows that her baby has pushed her to stay clean. A year later Diana continues to come to the Centre for clothes for her growing child and to talk to her client advocate.

This story is not unique. Every day our doors are open to strong women and men who are doing the hard work of trying to improve their lives. Whatever the circumstance surrounding their visit may be, the Lethbridge Pregnancy Care Centre is here to support and encourage them as they make their journey towards healing.

### Services

### Information & Client Care Support

We provide thorough and accurate information about pregnancy, parenting, adoption, and abortion at the request of the client. Volunteers are trained as client advocates to walk alongside clients facing an unintended pregnancy and present appropriate information. Client advocates journey with clients and offer support as they make their decision. They also continue caring for clients by helping them access physical supports and walking with them as they work through their emotions.

### **Practical Support**

The clothing room (containing both baby and maternity clothes) is available to clients on a monthly basis. One-time emergency packages (which can include diapers, formula, bus passes, and grocery cards) are given to clients in extreme need. The LPCC also provides new mothers with layettes full of new baby items. Outside community resources are referred when applicable.

#### Free Pregnancy Tests

Any client who suspects she may be pregnant is welcome to come for a free, self-administered pregnancy test. LPCC is not a medical facility and every client is encouraged to follow up with their doctor.

#### Adoption Referrals & Support

Open or closed adoption information is provided based on the specific desires of the client. If a client chooses to make an adoption plan for their child, their LPCC client advocate will walk alongside them as they make that journey.

#### Post Abortion & Grief Care

We offer both individual care and support groups for clients who have made an abortion decision. Our client advocates are specifically trained to navigate this often difficult choice while showing unconditional love and support for the client.



### Volunteers


